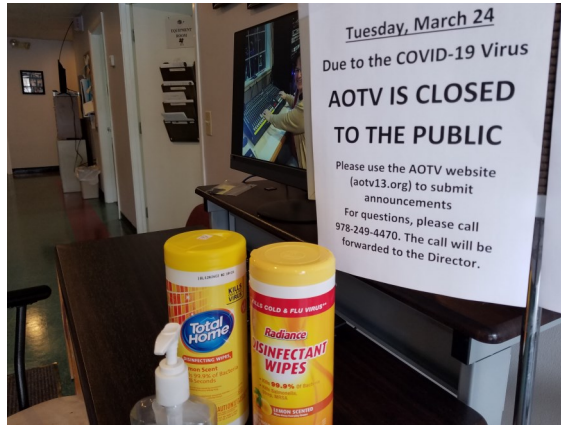


**Athol-Orange Community Television

Carol's Message



We had big party plans for AOTV's 25th Anniversary in March 2020. We had designed and sent invitations to more than 200 people, devised a fabulous menu, decorated the studio with silver, created certificates for the producers, had 25th Anniversary candy kisses and thumb drives as favors, constructed a fantastic presentation and produced an incredible highlight video of the past 25 years.

The week of the party, we heard the word *pandemic* for the first time. It didn't take long to cancel everything, but now what? How can we still have our Annual Meeting and celebrate our Anniversary? Well, we are a TV station and we stream, so it quickly changed to a live event with only four of us in the facility. We quickly learned Zoom and accomplished our goal of celebrating while keeping everyone safe.

Things quickly changed. We closed the facility to the public, but we still had a PEG Access TV station and radio station to run. With nearly every community event being altered to a virtual format, AOTV was there, ready to connect the community even when the community members were apart.

We swiftly adapted the Selectboard meetings and other government meetings to Zoom, and produced Town Meetings with our Production Truck that were outside.

In May, AOTV produced the 17th annual Food-a-thon, a 12-hour event on television and radio to raise funds for the local food pantries. 100% of the donations are directed toward food insecurity in the community. An entirely "Zoomed" event with live interviews and pre-recorded musical guests raised \$42,500, a 51% increase over the previous years.



Graduations and parade celebrations for high school seniors and their families were revamped for social distancing. AOTV was on the frontline to produce, edit, air, and stream all the events for Mahar Regional High School and Athol High School. Bonnie Benjamin's *Shining Lights* program has been its own shining light, with crucial inter-

views which brings the latest updates about COVID-19 and how it effects the community. Field hockey was covered in the fall, since no spectators were allowed. Shane produced and co-hosted with Ken Purdie *Friday Night Movie Thing* to entertain the community, in lieu of Friday Night football games. We counted down to midnight with a 4-hour virtual *Starry, Starry Night's* 25th Anniversary on New Year's Eve. Our staff continued to work hard through 2020 with very few volunteers. We were honored with *essential employee* status that serve the public.



The AOTV's 25th Annual Auction was reimagined from pre-recorded hosts to winner pick-ups. We followed all the safety protocols, and state and CDC guidelines. The Auction was five days instead of two, and we had less than 25 people in the facility each day instead of the normal 75 plus. All the volunteers need to be commended and thanked; talent, TV crew, phone personnel, bid sorters, board set-up and markers, supervisors, food coordinators, audit and validation personnel and front-line workers for pick-ups. It was an incredibly coordinated effort, and we grossed over \$27,300 with your support.



We have started opening for one production at a time and we hope members will come back in 2021. Congratulations on making it through 2020! Thanks for being part of AOTV and WVAO.

Bruce Dubrulle, Sr.

January 15, 1945—January 11, 2021

Bruce was a kind soul and he will be sorely missed. He joined AOTV in 1995 and was my rock for many years. I knew if I asked him to volunteer, he would come through for me. His answer always was, "I have no problem with that."

Bruce was on the Board of Directors, including being President 2002-2004. He was so proud of AOTV, he would jump at the chance to give a tour. You couldn't miss him at the Home Show or the Fall Fest showing off the newest camera or Production Truck. He always found time to help with the menial tasks including cleaning, painting and yard work.

Bruce loved camerawork and loved to train others on the equipment. He covering Select-board Meetings for six years, during the tumultuous years that were known as the "Tuesday Night Fights." This was back in the day when it was necessary to pick-up, set-up, breakdown and return a trunk full of equipment each time. Every year, he had his designated assignment for River Rat Race at the Daniel Shays Highway Bridge, and would be there even if it was his anniversary. For Food-a-thon, he volunteered 12 hours as the roving cameraman and enjoyed recording the children at the Red Wagon Brigade. At Auction time he shined. He shot all the footage for the Auction Preview Shows and was the go-to Camera 1 Operator for the AOTV Auction. Bruce crewed for countless other studio and field production throughout the last 25 years. He was my friend.
